HOME MODIFICATIONS

Under the Fair Housing Act, individuals with disabilities are able to have their home or apartment approved for reasonable modifications, such as widening doors or adding entryway ramps. However, these modifications can be expensive- luckily, there are several programs that can help cover the costs.

HERE ARE FOUR WAYS TO PAY FOR MODIFICATIONS

MEDICAID

Programs cover the cost of basic equipment to provide mobility and offer assistance in paying for general home modifications

MEDICARE

Original Medicare only covers durable medical equipment such as walk in tubs

Medicare Advantage may help cover actual home modifications

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GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS

HUD helps pay for significant home modifications with insured loans

USDA offers loans and grants to cover home modifications for individuals living in rural areas

Safe at Home pays for minor modifications and safety improvements for low income seniors
