




# Your Voting Rights in Arizona:

## A Voting Guide for Arizonans with Disabilities

### You Have the Right to Vote

You can vote if you:

- ✓ You are a U.S. citizen<sup>1</sup> and live in Arizona.
- ✓ You are 18 years old on Election Day.
- ✓ You have lived in your voting area for 30+ days.
- ✓ You are not in prison.
- ✓ You are registered to vote.

 **If You Have a Guardian** — You may still have the right to vote! A judge must rule that you cannot vote for this right to be taken away.

### Getting Help to Vote

You have the right to vote privately and independently. If you need help voting, you can get help from:

- A parent, guardian, or family member
- A friend
- A case manager, social worker, or therapist
- A poll worker
- Someone you trust (not your boss or union leader)
  - Ask for help before you go into the voting booth
  - The helper must fill out a form at the polls

#### Accessible Voting Places

Must:


- Be easy to get into
- Have a clear path to the voting area
- Have at least one accessible voting machine

#### Helpful Tools at the Polls

- Magnifier to help you see
- Chair if you need to sit while waiting in line or voting
- Bottles of water and sun protection such as a hat and sunscreen

### Voting Without Going to the Polls

You can vote early or from home:

-  Early voting (vote before Election Day by joining the Active Early Voting List)
- Vote by mail (ask for a ballot to be mailed to you)

<sup>1</sup> If you only want to vote in Federal Elections (for example, voting for the U.S. President), you do not have to show proof of U.S. Citizenship to vote.

### What You Need to Vote

- ✓ Be registered to vote
  - ✓ State-issued photo ID
  - ✓ Know where your polling place is
- Learn about the people and issues on your ballot

### Provisional Ballot

If a voter's eligibility is not certain, a voter will be offered a provisional ballot. Contact your County Election Official for further assistance.
